

Summer Stipends 2024

The Winston Center for Leadership and Ethics engages students, faculty, staff, and alumni in the intellectual exploration of leadership and ethics in business and society.

Description:

The Winston Center welcomes applications from students who engage in uncompensated part-time or full-time internships that allow them to cultivate their leadership skills in local, state, or federal government, public interest groups, non-governmental organizations, advocacy work, direct service, research, and education during the summer.

Eligibility:

All BC undergraduate students are welcome to submit an application. Please note, you need to be enrolled at BC in Fall 2024 to be eligible.

Application Procedures:

Students must submit:

- A description of the organization for which you will work, along with a brief summary of the work you will perform, including number of weeks and hours per week of the internship term (no more than 2 double-spaced pages)
- A personal statement describing the reasons for your interest in the position and how it aligns with the Winston Center's mission (no more than 1 double-spaced page)
- An academic letter of recommendation from a faculty member
- A copy of your official transcript
- A copy of your resume
- The official offer letter from the organization which must indicate whether the internship will be in person or remote, and confirmation of the weeks and hours you will work

Application materials should be submitted via email to winston.center@bc.edu by May 6, 2024.

Decisions will be sent by May 13.
