Overview:

Team Size: Each team should consist of **3-5** participants.

The Competition:

Round 1: Idea Submission

- What: Submit your original projects, portfolios, or ideas.
- Goal: Our panel will review submissions and shortlist the most promising ideas.
- Outcome: A list of innovative concepts will progress to the next round.
- Submission Deadline: April 9th
- How to Submit: Send your submissions via email to winston.center@bc.edu.

Round 2: Market Research & Validation

- What: Shortlisted participants will present research/data to validate their idea's market need.
- **Presentation Requirements**: Provide findings from surveys, interviews, or secondary research that support the demand for your idea.
- **Goal**: Demonstrate the market potential of your concept.
- Submission Deadline: April 18th
- How to Submit: Send your market research and validation presentations via email to winston.center@bc.edu.
- Outcome: The strongest market research will advance to the final round.

Round 3: Fusion Element & Final Presentation

- What: In this final round, participants will receive a fusion element or an unexpected challenge on the spot.
- **Time**: You will have 90 minutes to integrate this new element into your existing idea and prepare for your presentation.
- **Goal**: Show your ability to innovate and adapt under pressure.

- Final Presentation Date: April 25th
- **Outcome**: Present your revamped idea to the judges in a "Shark Tank"-style pitch.
