Joseph Fuller, MBA

Professor of Management Practice in General Management, Co-lead of Managing the Future of Work Initiative at HBS Harvard Business School

Joseph Fuller teaches the Becoming a General Manager course in the MBA program and previously led The Entrepreneurial Manager course. A 1981 HBS graduate, he founded Monitor Group and served as CEO until 2006, advising until its acquisition by Deloitte in 2012. With extensive experience in corporate strategy across technology-intensive industries, he is now researching the evolution of CEOs and the C-suite in public companies.



Connie Hadley, PhD

Founder of the Institute for Life at Work and Research Associate Professor in the Management and Organizations Department **Boston University Questrom School of Business**

Dr. Constance (Connie) Noonan Hadley is an organizational psychologist, founder of the Institute for Life at Work, research associate professor at Boston University Questrom School of Business, and consulting researcher at Microsoft Research Lab. She holds a Ph.D. from Harvard, an MBA from Wharton, and a BA from Princeton, and is a sought-after speaker on the future of work, team effectiveness, psychological safety, work loneliness and relationships, inclusive cultures, and employee well-being. Her research has appeared in major outlets like the Harvard Business Review and The New York Times. Dr. Hadley also serves on the Board of Trustees at McLean Hospital, and is a mentor to low-income, first-generation university students.

Vanessa Conzon, PhD
Professor of Management and Organization
Boston College Carroll School of Management

Vanessa Conzon is an assistant professor of Management & Organization at the Boston College Carroll School of Management. She is also the recipient of the 2024 Rosabeth Moss Kanter Award for Excellence in Work-Family Research for her publication, *The Equality Policy Paradox: Gender Differences in How Managers Implement Gender Equality–Related Policies*. She completed her PhD at MIT Sloan in the Organization Studies group. Her research explores the relationship between employees' autonomy with organizational goals, and how this relates to diversity and (in)equality.
