Students will complete the requirements for UCTC in their first four semesters in the program (Summer 1, AY1, and Summer 2) and then complete the requirements for ELP in following six semesters in the program (AY2, Summer 3, AY3, Summer 4). Two of the ELP electives will count towards the UCTC degree program.

The practicum must begin in the third summer, with 1 credit in the summer, 3 credits in the subsequent fall, and two credits in the subsequent spring.
