## Requirements for Most Medical, Dental & Veterinary Schools

- 1 year of Biology with lab
- 1 year of General Chemistry with lab
- 1 year of Organic Chemistry with lab
- 1 year of Physics with lab
- 1 year of Mathematics (Recommended)
- 1 year of English (Highly Recommended)
- 1 semester of Statistics (Highly Recommended)
- 1 semester of Biochemistry (Highly Recommended)

<sup>\*</sup>Some Health Profession Graduate Schools have additional requirements

## Almost All Health Professional Schools Require Standardized Tests

The Medical College Admission Test (MCAT)

Biological and Biochemical Foundations of Living Systems (59 Q)

Chemical and Physical Foundations of Biological Systems (59 Q)

Psychological, Social and Biological Foundation of Behavior (59 Q)

Critical Analysis and Reasoning Skills (53 Q)

Median Score is 511 Range: 472-528

#### The Dental Admission Test (DAT)

Survey of Natural Sciences: Biology, General Chem, Organic Chem Perceptual Ability Test, Reading Comprehension Test, Quantitative Reasoning Test Median score for admissions is 19 Range 1-30

#### Graduate Record Examination (GRE)

General Test required for Veterinary Medicine and Physician Assistant (and other Allied Health)

Verbal and Quantitative Scores (similar to SAT)




### Boston College Placement Statistics


